2.2.2.1 Description of Coordination of Services for American Indian/Alaska Native Students

A tutor will provide tutoring services during the regular school year to Indian students that make D's and/or F's on their report cards. The tutor will provide services directly in the elementary students' classrooms at the direction of the teacher. The parent committee determines the priority of services after reviewing parent, teacher, and student surveys and student Stanford 10 achievement test scores. Due to these preferences and scores, tutoring will concentrate on reading, math and writing. As with the Title I program, elementary students will be taught to their highest potential; beginning at the students' level of understanding. The computer will be used for students to work on math skills, basic competency skills, and preparation for the graduation exam. Funds will be used to hire one full-time tutor, provide fringe benefits, supplies, travel, and other services. Supplies will include items for core subject manipulative, and resources about Native American history and culture. Travel will be used for attending meetings and workshops. The "other category will be used to purchase telecommunication services from the telephone company so that the computer can connect to the Internet for student use.

Title VII is used to support prescriptive instruction with a tutor using Classworks. Classworks is an educational internet program funded by Title I. The telecommunication services are the Access Points needed for the Indian Education Classroom to support the wireless connection for the computers (Chomebooks) funded by Title I.
