Bake in a preheated convection oven at 350°F for 6- 8 minutes.

Bake in a preheated conventional oven at 400°F for 8-12 minutes.

Microwave Oven:

Place frozen Belgian waffle sticks (6 pieces) on a microwave safe dish uncovered. Heat on full power (high) for 35-40 seconds. Microwave heating times vary, so adjust accordingly.

Holding Time:

Place heated Belgian waffle sticks in a single layer in steam table pan. Belgian waffle sticks can be held on a steam table (set on medium), partially covered, up to 30 minutes.

HINT: Heated Belgian waffle sticks should reach an internal temperature of 150-160°F.
